

AC Asks: I am a Hindu male. I had been doing well in my career and was working in a foreign nation in a reputed organization. However, recently, due to some internal politics I lost my job. One of my acquaintances has suggested me to wear a Gomed (Hessonite) of 3 carats or more to get the benefits of the Rahu Mahadasha. Is it advisable to wear a Gomed and, if yes, how many carats of the gemstone should I wear. If no, then which stone should I wear? My DOB is 24-10-1981, TOB is 07:10 AM and POB is Sainthia, Birbhum, West Bengal, India.



Astrologer Ashutosh: AC! Rahu is the planet which gives the most amount of stress and anxiety to a person. It is a shadow planet and its shadow falls over all aspects of life which are directly or indirectly influenced by it. As Rahu is placed in the house of profession in your natal kundli it directly and primarily affects your career.

You were born under Libra (Tula) ascendent and Leo (Simha) moon sign. A debilitated Surya is placed in the lagna and since last sixteen months or so Rahu is in transit in Libra along with Saturn over your natal Surya. This, combined with the Rahu mahadasha and Saturn antardasha, was bound to give setbacks and anxieties related to your work and income. Three more months of Rahu's transit's effects will be there. You can expect to be in a good job by August 2014.

Gomed will be good for you but wear it in more than 7 carats weight on the middle finger. It should be worn on a silver ring. You should keep wearing Gomed till the end of Rahu Mahadasha. It will protect you from the unexpected and sudden changes which Rahu brings in life. This does not mean that the changes will not occur but they will not harm you much and you will be able to cope with them in a way which will make these changes beneficial for you.

Besides the Gomed you should also wear a gemstone for Venus which is the primary yogakarak planet for you. Venus also helps you in working abroad and staying there for long periods. For Venus, you can wear either a White Sapphire or a Fire Opal on the ring finger. This gem too should be in a silver ring.
